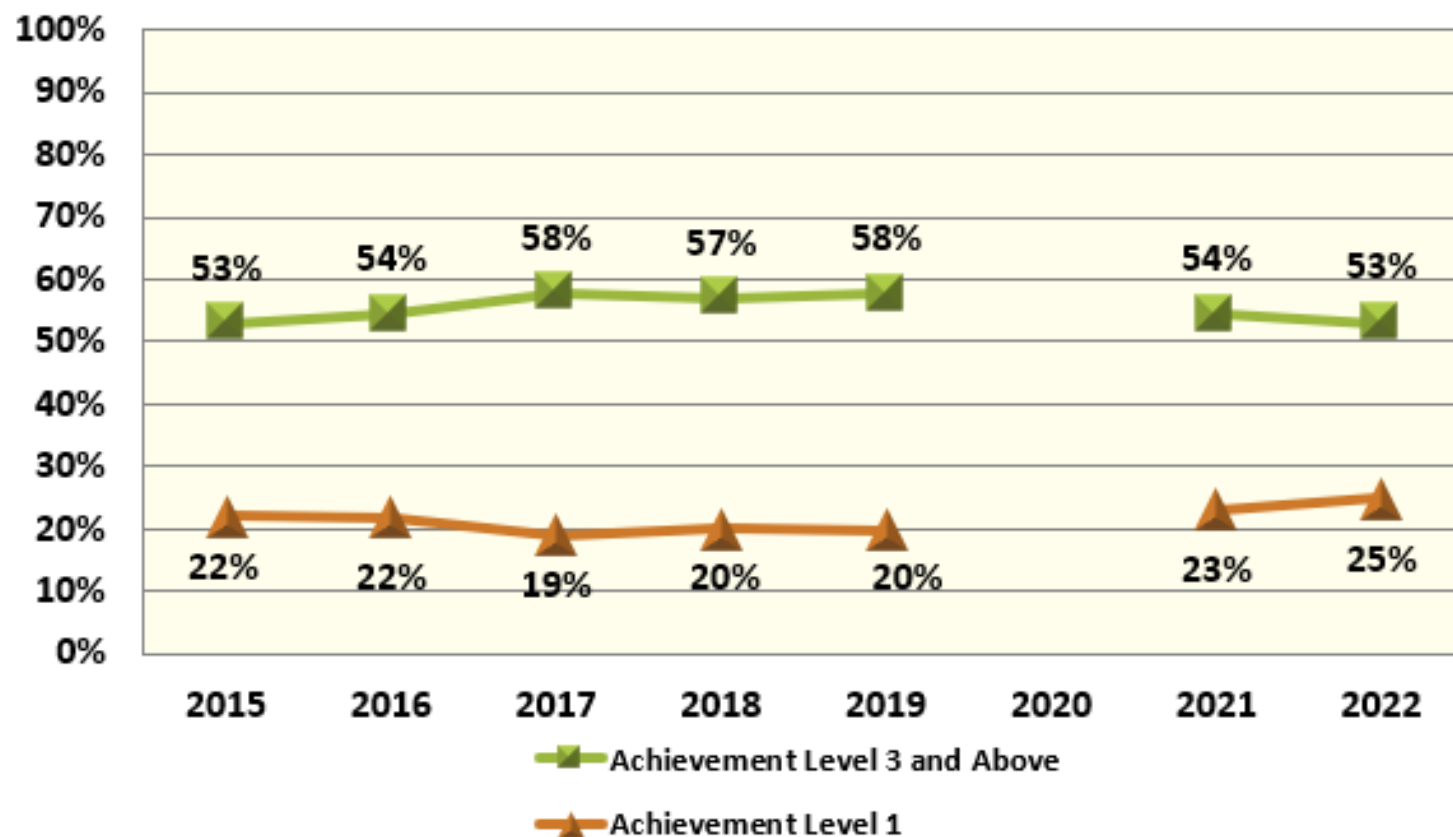

Why Focus on Early Literacy?

NEARLY 90% OF STUDENTS WHO
FAILED TO EARN A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA
WERE STRUGGLING READERS IN **THIRD GRADE.**

Students who are not reading proficiently in third grade are **FOUR TIMES** more likely to drop out or fail to graduate from high school.

African American and Hispanic students not reading proficiently in third grade are **SIX TIMES** more likely to drop out or fail to graduate from high school.

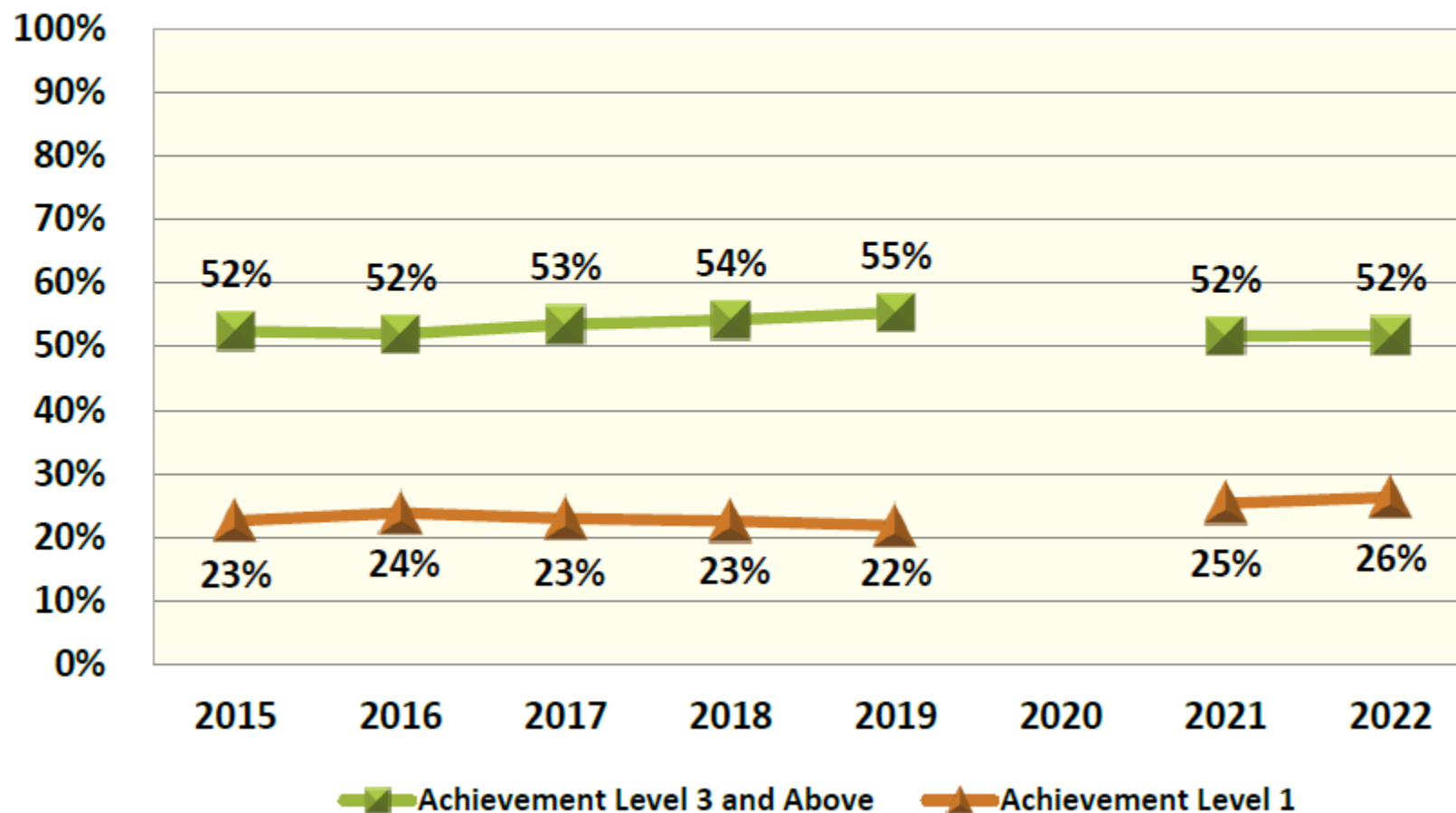

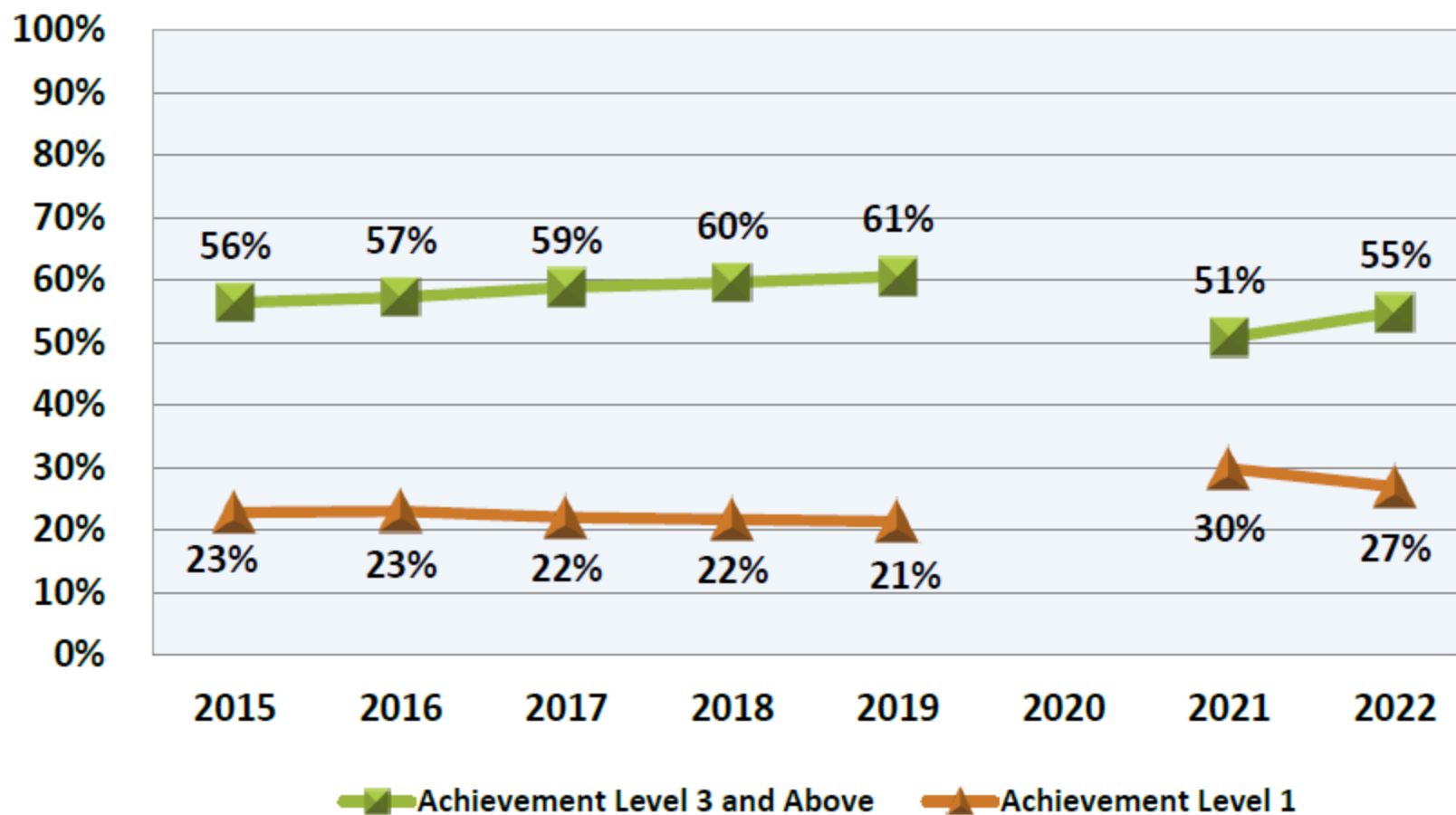

By Achievement Level



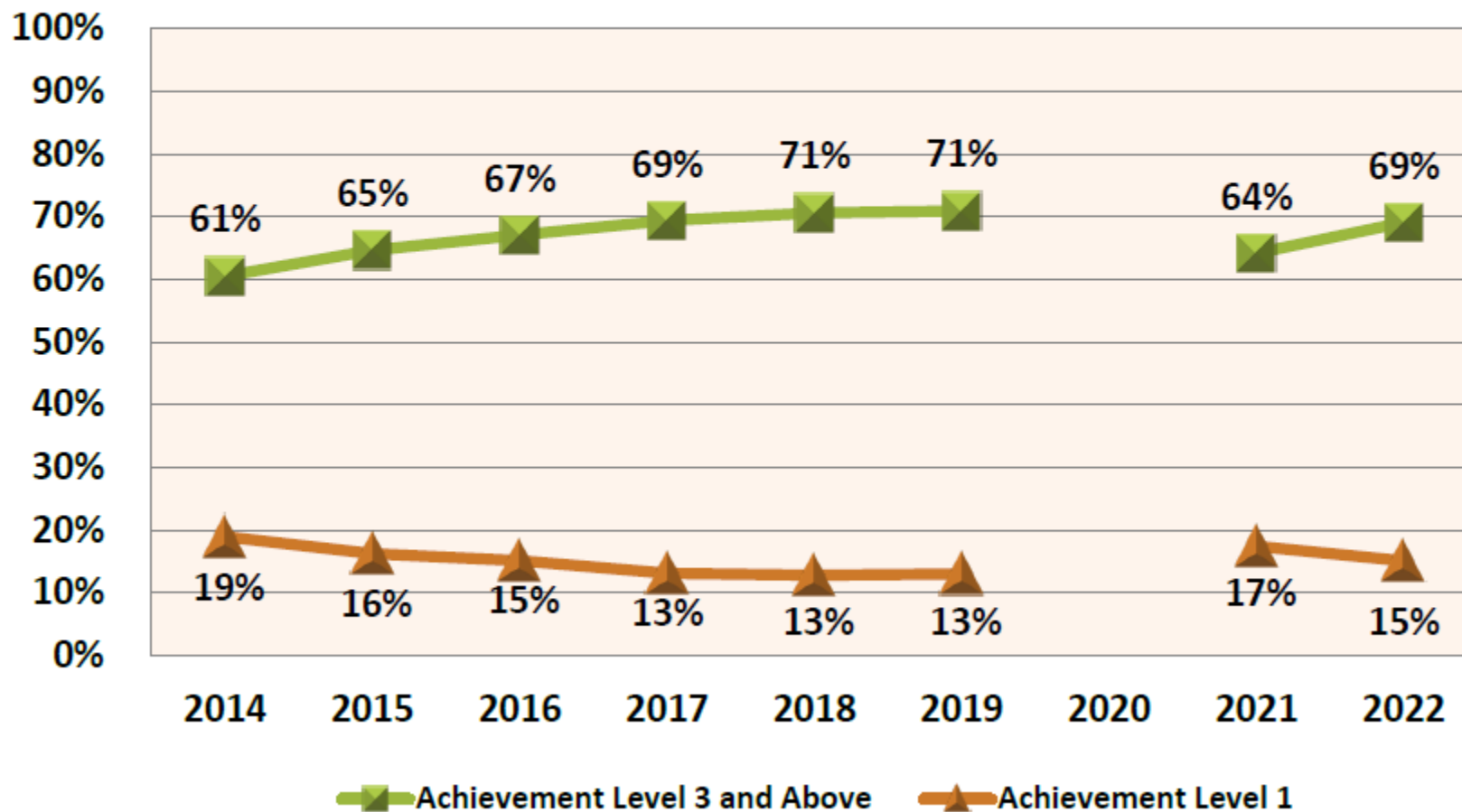
Mathematics – FSA and EOCs Grades 3-8

By Achievement Level



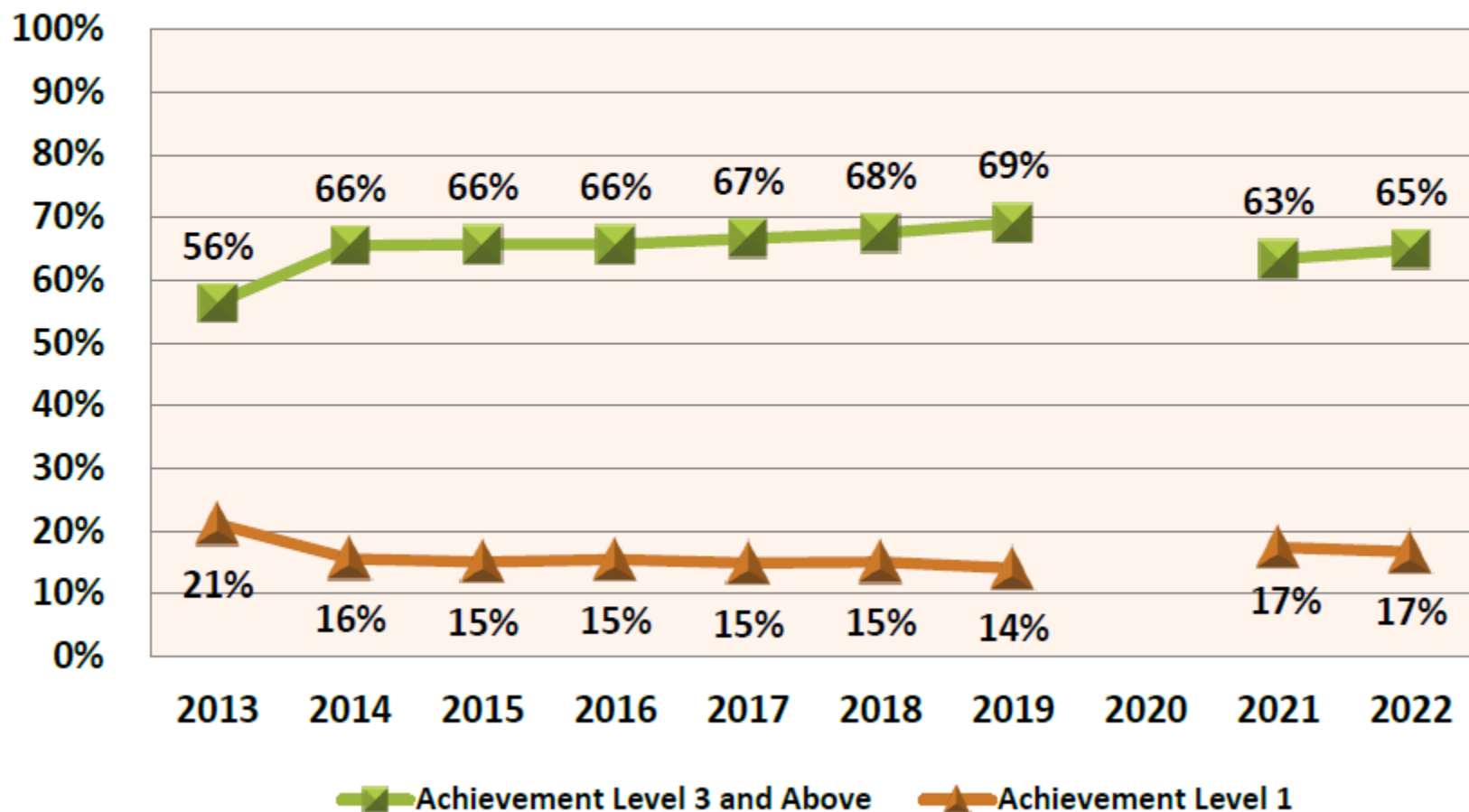
Social Studies – Civics EOC

Social Studies – U.S. History EOC

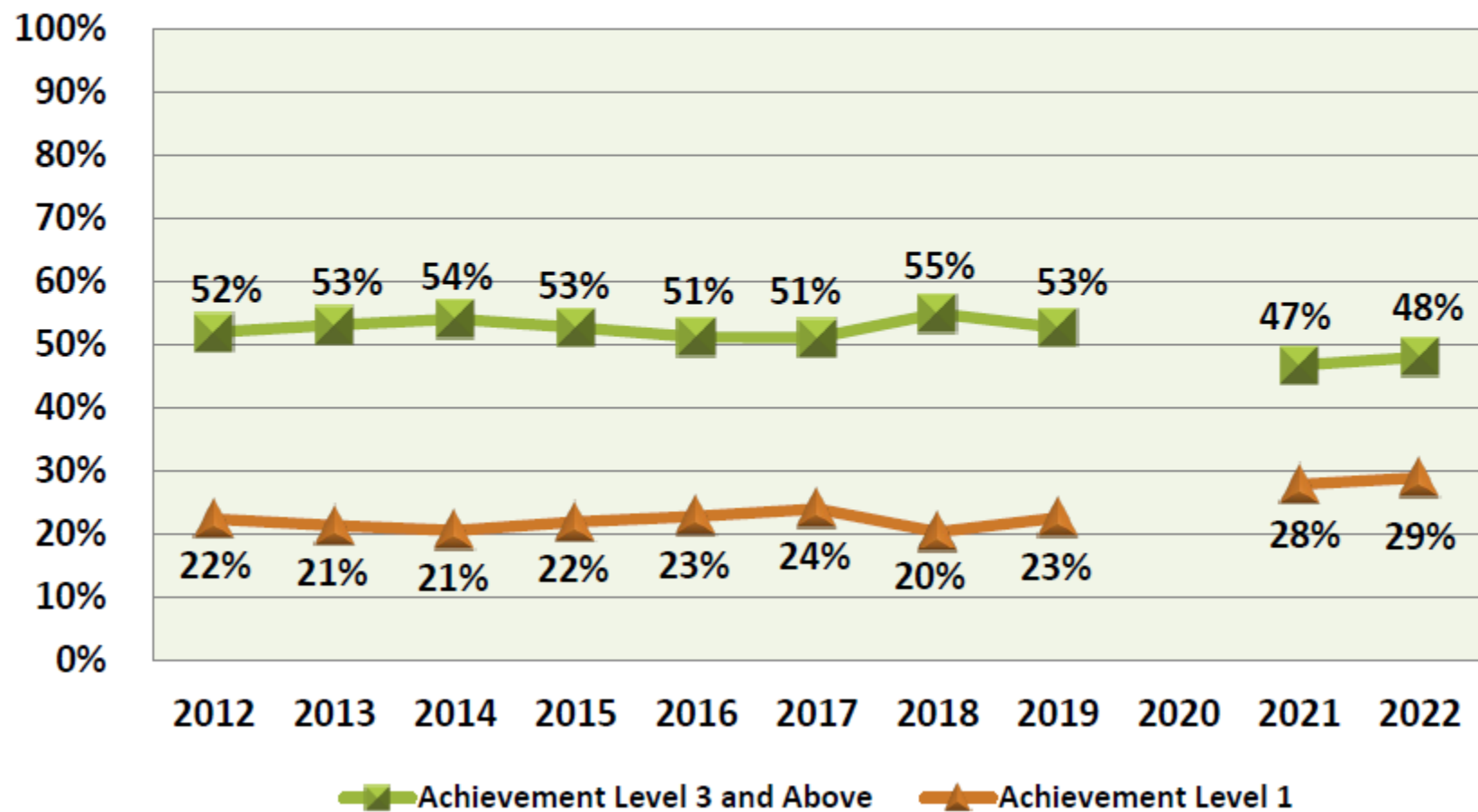

Science – Grade 5

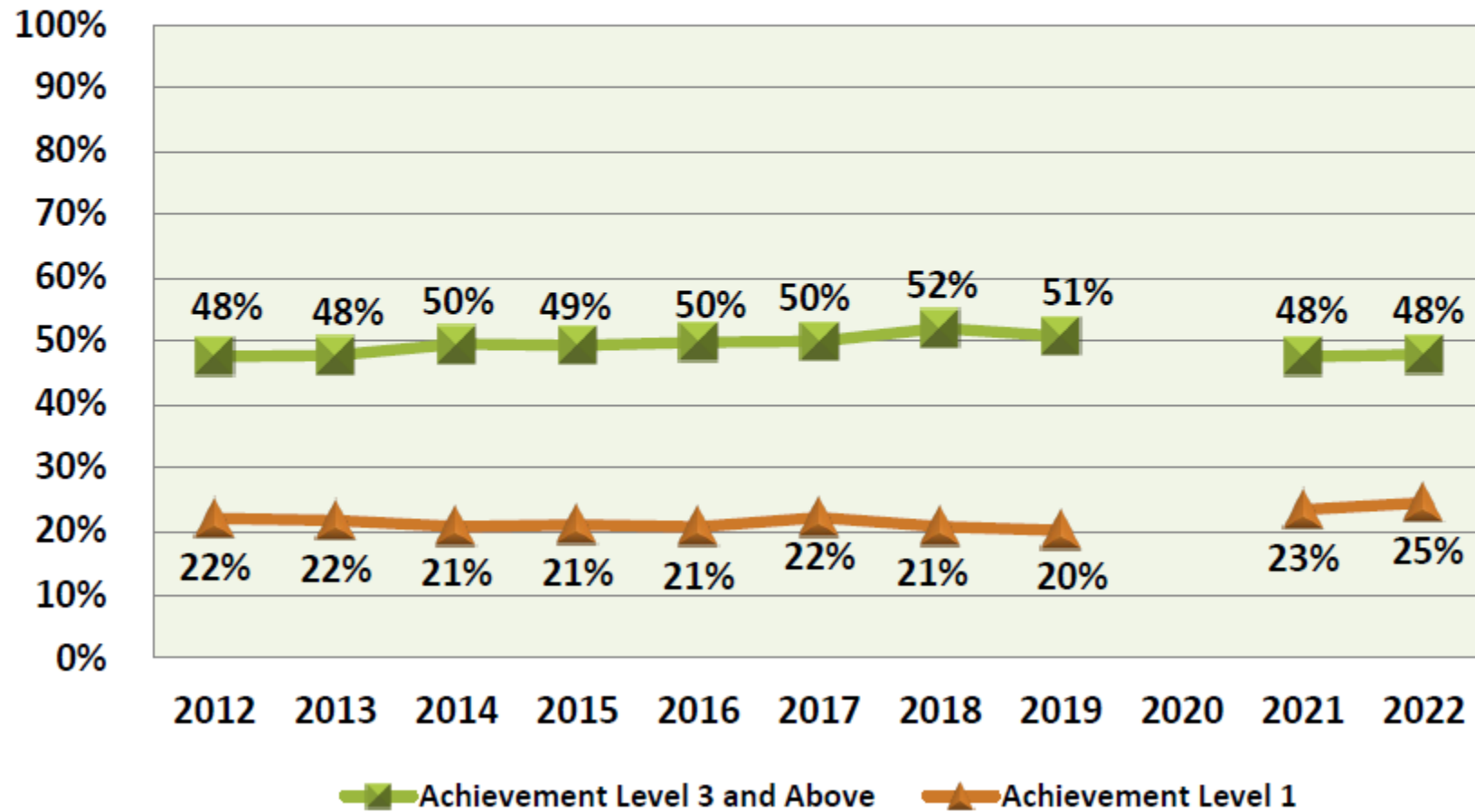

School Performance Highlights

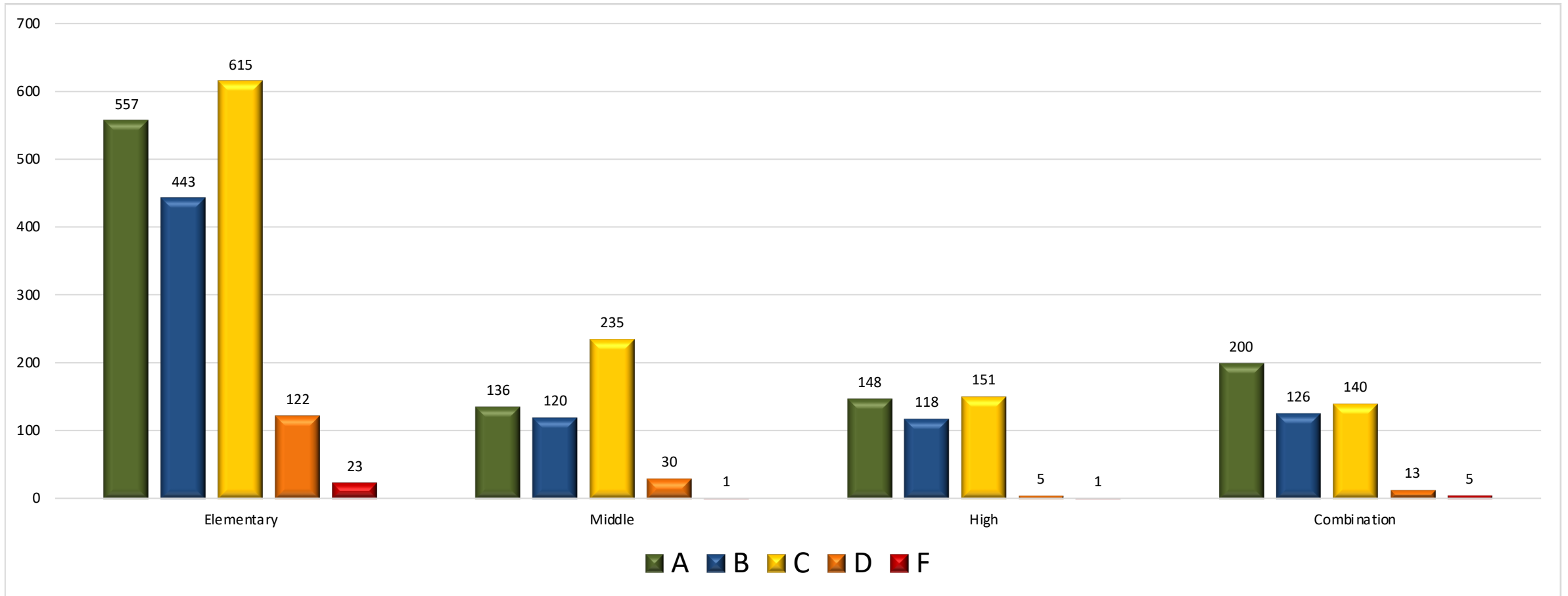
- In 2022, initial school grades are as follows:
 - A – 33% (1,041 schools)
 - B – 25% (807 schools)
 - C – 36% (1,141 schools)
 - D – 5% (170 schools)
 - F – 1% (30 schools)
- This distribution is very similar to 2019, which is the last time school grades were fully issued:
 - A – 35% (1,181 schools)
 - B – 27% (909 schools)
 - C – 32% (1,065 schools)
 - D – 5% (159 schools)
 - F – 0% (14 schools)

Overall School Performance

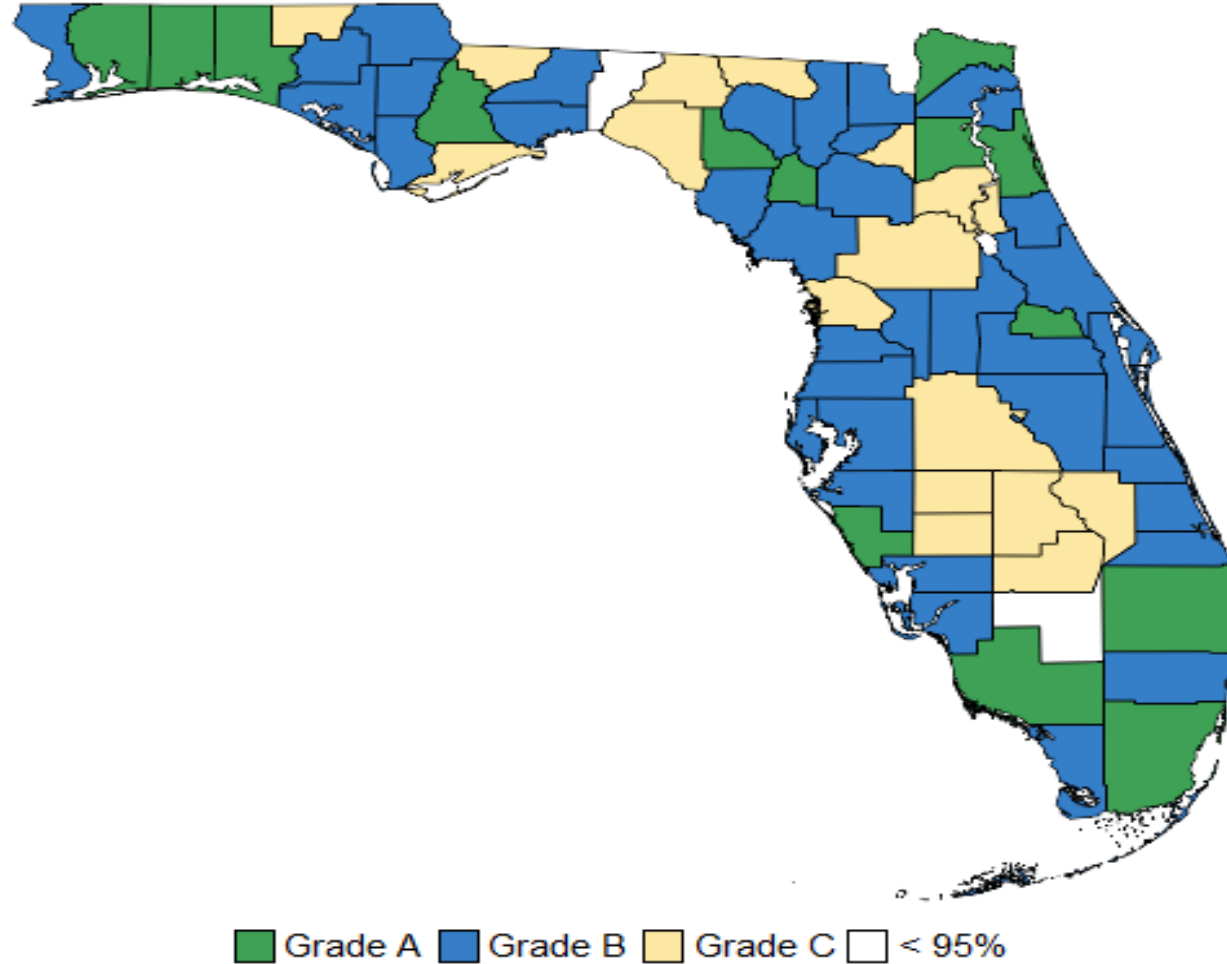
The School Grades for 2022 represent a **significant improvement** over school performance in 2021.

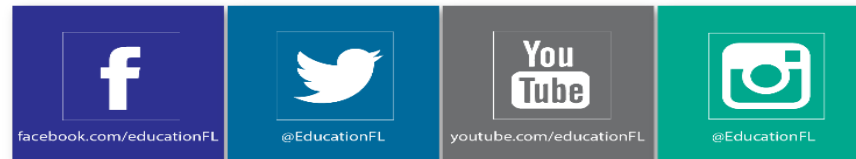
