There are eleven chapters that cover subjects including Financial Behavior, Budgeting, Saving, Credit, Investing, Taxes, and Insurance. - The Stock Market Challenge: A ten-week simulation of an investment account. Students are given \$100,000 to invest over a 10-week period. They utilize a fully integrated investing platform that provides real-world experiences 24/7. The SMC is a competition with regional winners awarded prizes for the top three finishers. - The Budget Game: A semester long simulation where the student plays the role of a young person attending the last six months of college and then the first twelve months in a new job. In this role, the student must make decisions for saving money while meeting the predictable and unexpected costs of life. The game can be played gradually over a semester or binged within a short period. The Budget Game is not a regional competition, but the player's score is tabulated and compared with competitors around the state.
