




#### 22-23 FAST Scale Scores: As the percentage of students of socio-economic disadvantage increases, ELA scores decrease.






### FL 4th graders stand-in for national avg on 2007 NAEP Reading





### On 2022 NAEP, Florida fourth graders placed 3rd (and statistically tied for 1st) in Reading.

On 2022 NAEP, Florida fourth graders placed 3rd (and statistically tied for 1st) in Reading.

Florida not only avoided a pandemic performance dip – its fourth grade reading scores *improved* slightly, as happened in only a handful of states.

There are no other comparably large states in the top performance band nationwide.
